Presentation: The Slovenia AZ Hive by Mark Chorba, Past NRVBA President

Mark presented a brief history of the AZ hive and beekeeping practices in Slovenia. He highlighted some of the advantages of this type of hive including the ease of inspecting the sliding frames and the huge advantage of not needing to lift heavy supers. The focus of the presentation was an update on his own AZ hive started from a swarm this spring. Mark has been pleased with the progress of the hive and is considering additional AZ hives next season. He welcomed members to contact him to arrange a visit to view his hive.
