## Minutes of Meeting of New River Valley Bee Keepers' Association on Thursday September 11 2014 at 6:30 pm

Richard Reid opened the meeting. He made a request for a volunteer to staff a table at the Shawsville Library Fall Festival. This will be held on Saturday Oct 4<sup>th</sup> from 10 am until 2 pm. There are posters, handouts, a teaching hive and an observation hive available.

Jerry made a request for an assistant to help him run the annual classes, so he can delegate some of the larger items such as arranging meals, setting up the space. Planning will begin next month. Jerry will still oversee the whole process.

After some discussion it was decided to take a vote at the next meeting to determine if a donation should come from the club or if we should encourage people to donate individually.

This includes a manual extractor, and it was suggested that maybe the Association could purchase it in order to loan out to members as an additional extractor, especially for members with a small amount to extract.
