Treasurer's report accepted

Old Business:

Extractor management has been taken over by Jim Hill, Bob Whiton, and Richard Reid – Sue Hossack pointed out that it is taking three people to take over the job she was doing alone! Report on past field days:

There was a discussion on whether the club should get a vaporizer or oxylic or formic acid to sell to members.

Oxalic acid comes in inexpensive crystals, you can get it as wood bleach from the hardware store, but as it is not labeled as pesticide, you should buy the correct item from a bee supplier.

MiteawayQuick Strips shouldn't be used if too hot since bees must be able to fan and spread fumes. Brian Murphy will bring his vaporizer to next field day to show people. Oxalic acid can burn off mouth parts if not diluted adequately.

New business:

Annual VT Bug Fest Oct 15<sup>th</sup> Volunteers needed. Free T-shirt and lunch will be provided.

Oct 1: Shawsville Fall Harvest Festival at Meadowbrook library

Spraying in SC for zika virus apparently caused a lot of bee deaths, Jim Hill will make calls
