November 8, 2018 Minutes

The October, 2018 meeting was cancelled due to inclement weather.

President Fred Jones called the meeting to order at 1830 with 53 in attendance.

Announcements:

Treasurer Audit- Lynn and Molly completed the audit with no irregularities noted. Fred mentioned the need to set up regular guidelines for future audits.

Member Larry Larson recently passed away. A sale of his beekeeping equipment, with proceeds going to his family, was held in the parking area prior to the meeting. Fred thanked all those who participated.

Jerry announced Bug Fest at Va Tech went well. Due to remodeling it was moved to the third floor of Squires and the space was a little tight. This is our largest public event.

The, "So, You Want To Be A Beekeeper" presentations will begin in January at the regional libraries. The library in Dublin will be added this year. Jerry will give the dates to Sue for the website.

Students from Blacksburg High School announced they have administration approval and are starting a new Beekeeping Club. They are collecting equipment now and anticipate starting two new hives in the spring.

What you should be doing with your bees:

It's been fairly warm so far so the bees may be using up their stores. It is getting too late for syrup, below 50 degrees is considered the cutoff point by most. Camp feeding, sugar boards, fondant, etc. should be considered. Likely will not find it warm enough to go into the hives to move stores around, need to be very careful not to disturb the cluster. Moisture control is important. An insulation board on the inner cover is a good method. Time to place mouse guards. This is a good time to starting planning for spring. Acquire and repair equipment and read new materials.
